Ashley Wells, DC Smart Street Lighting Project

Here to discuss a project that will convert 72 thousand DC street lights into more energy efficient lights with remote monitoring and advanced LED technology.

Project began May 2022, currently in the Rehabilitation Phase, will finish by May 2024 and have 15 years of Asset Management where the lights will be maintained and replaced.

Project is broken up into 3 groups, Ward 1 will be part of Group 3 and further divided by ANC. Outreach and Engagement focus will start 45 days prior to the construction of the project. No parking signs will be put 72 hours before time needed.

ANC1D work will happen near March 2024 near the end of the project.

 - Attempt to reduce safety risks, commonly documented by residents. 25 neighbors signed letters in support of safety improvements.
 - The Brown/Monroe Intersection meets several of DDOTs stated criteria for road improvements
 - Roadway characteristics, crash patterns, equity, proximity and locations utilized by vulnerable road users.
 - ANC1D advises the District of Columbia Department of Transportation to prioritize resolving this issue scheduled for the next quarter of this fiscal year.
