- Grant Application for Friends of Peirce Mill on The Mid-Atlantic Grain Fair and Conference
 - O James Tandaric introduced Angela Kramer of Peirce Mill to present on the fair. Cost can be upwards to \$7,000 to close the street Peirce Mill wishes to close, the main reason for applying for the grant of \$3,000.
 - Grant application approved, unanimous 6-0-0 in favor.
- BZA Permit with Parlor Wines at 4221 Connecticut Avenue, NW
 - o James introduced the applicants
 - Owned by husband and wife team, internet sales only for wine, no on-premise sale, consumption, and no browsing by the public.
 - o Passed unanimous, 6-0-0 in favor.
- Resolution Regarding Transportation to School for Students with Special Needs
 - O James Tandaric and Stephanie Maltz presented on the resolution

- o Issues with OSSE bus services in the District and our community
- o If the buses don't come, DC encourages families to use public transit or private transportation like Uber or Lyft. For families with children 14 and under, cannot use those services. Reimbursement is slow and often at the wrong rate.
- O Many families cannot change their schedule daily and cannot front the costs for alternate modes of transit.
- Many compounding issues related to the delay of adequate bussing, including the denial of these children their required services at school and the requirement of school faculty to stay late
- O Resolution calls for increased funding for OSSE an better service to parents, their children, and the community at large
- o Passed 6-0-0, unanimous.
- Resolution Regarding the Budget at Murch Elementary School
 - Courtney Carlson presented on the resolution
 - Murch parents are asking for additional funds to address a shortage of students at the school
 - O Elias from CM Frumin's office presented the Councilmember's position on the issue at Murch regarding class size.
 - O Community members Allison Fitzsimmons and others presented, including the Co-Chair of the local LSAT organization
 - Requesting around \$230,000 from the Council to hire sufficient staff to meet student needs
 - o 6-0-0 passed, unanimous.
