 - O Gloria Garcia:
 - Marlene Berlin voted in as interim president of VNMS board.
 - Honey Bee Goods will be taking over the Sugar Fox space.
 - Last Saturday two cars suffered break-ins while patronizing businesses in the area.

- Mayor's Office of Community Relations and Services
 - O Not present.
- CM Frumin's Office
 - O Christian Damiana (Matt Frumin's Communications Director):
 - Tomorrow morning Bowser presents budget to the Council, Council Member Frumin will continue to advocate for his budget priorities
 - This past Monday, 3/20, CM Frumin introduced the Rent Stabilization Protection Amendment Act of 2023
 - Act will remove housing vouchers from rent stabilization laws, allowing vouchers to coexist with rent control without preventing the other. Legislation is meant to avoid artificially inflated rents.
 - CM Robert White has committed to hold a hearing on the legislation.
 - O Constituent: Requests an explanation on how things will work with the bill, curious how the city's payments to landlords will be brought under control.
 - O Christian Damiana: Act will allow DCHA to negotiate a reasonable rent, will apply federal rent reasonableness to rent-stabilized buildings. Only applies to new leases, not current ones, when leases are renewed they can be renegotiated along the same lines.
 - Encourages usage of constituent services form on CM Frumin'.

- ANC 3F Public Safety Update from Second District, Metropolitan Police Department
 O Not present.
- DC Water Update
 - O DC Water provided updates on its CIPP relining in a presentation. Please view the meeting's recorded video for specifics from the presentation.
 - Anticipated CIPP schedule provided, noted that weather and other unforeseen events can delay the schedule
 - Remaining portions of streamwork may cause high noise: heavy rock delivery and hauling, stream bypass pumping, sewer bypass pumping.
 - To be added to weekly project updates soapstone.info@dcwater.com
 - If there is an emission of air pollutants over the listed limits no shut down provision
 - O Constituent: Question whether bypass pipe can withstand a tree falling on it, wondering whether a bypass pipe being obstructed in some way whether that would stop the process.
 - DC Water: No immediate answer.
 - O Constituent: Interested in what the monitoring equipment looks like, interested in the refrigerator truck since that is where emissions can leak quickly.
 - DC Water: Lab results are back on Fridays.
 - O Mitch Baer: Continuing question of Site 1 tree whether it would be cut down, would like to be kept in the loop for what happens between NPS and the tree.
- Resolution Regarding DC Water's Main and Trunk Sewer Lines Relining Project in Soapstone Valley: Issues of CIPP Curing Method, Need for Shut Down Provision, Insulating Cover for Sump Pump near Albemarle Ave Trailhead, and Construction and Maintenance of By-pass System. (8:22pm - 8:42pm)
 - O Mitch Baer presented the resolution.
 - 6-0-0 vote, all-in-favor, passed.
- Resolution Encouraging the National Park Service to Install E.coli and other hazardous dissolved materials warning signs at Rock Creek Park Trailheads for Trails with Creek Crossings, Warning hikers and trail users to refrain from contact with creek waters due to the high levels of E. coli and other potentially hazardous dissolved materials. (8:43pm - 8:53pm)
 - O Mitch Baer presented
 - O Constituent: Wonders whether these levels are the new normal, or whether they will improve. Does not know whether these signs would solve a problem, concerned whether this is an effective use of resources?
 - Constituent (in response): Was not concerned with the levels until she spoke with the USGS that was taking samples at Joyce Road in Rock

Creek. Scientists that were sampling told constituent that they should warn people to not go into the water.

- O Constituent: Was told that E. Coli gets into streams very frequently, was told no reason for concern unless you get food poisoning. Unsure whether the levels are practically hazardous based off of research several years ago. Wondering whether we should conduct more research whether these levels are high enough to merit warning signs.
- O Baer: NPS has awarded a grant to Rock Creek Conservancy to put up signs in some areas of the watershed in Montgomery County, MD. We are not rasing an issue that is an issue that hasn't already been brought, up, what we are asking for is additional signage in an area that people go and frequently get into the water.

 - Sunday October 22nd, 2023. Mill will be running. Partnering with the grain alliance.
 - Hoping to close Shoemaker Street for the day to create an area where local farmers can sell grain and baked good.
