- 1. Call to order (Pirrotti)
 - Call to order at 6:33pm
- 2. Roll Call (George)
 - a. Present for roll call were all 8 Commissioners:

- 3. **Determination of quorum** (Pirrotti)
 - a. A quorum was present
- 4. Approval of agenda (Pirrotti)
 - a. Commissioner George moved to add one item to the agenda, a draft resolution concerning speed bumps on the 4800 block of 7th St NW. The vote in favor was 8-0.
 - b. Commissioner George moved to adopt the agenda as amended. A roll call vote was taken and the agenda was approved 8-0.
- 5. Approval of June 2023 ANC 4D Public Meeting Minutes (George)
 - a. Commissioner George moved to adopt the draft June 2023 meeting minutes. The motion passed without objection.
- **6.** Treasurer's Report (Courniotes)
 - a. Commissioner Courniotes presented the Q3 Quarterly Financial Report
 - ANC 4D had no expenditures this quarter, so it was a simple quarterly report
 - The Commission's balance is \$8,944.42
 - We are seeking to ensure more rapid disbursement of QFRs; hoping for disbursements to
 occur so that we can more aggressively move to disburse funds. We are awaiting ~\$5,000
 each for the past two quarters.
 - Commissioner Courniotes moved to approve the Q3 QFR. A roll call vote was taken and the QFR was approved, 8-0.
 - b. The Commission also discussed the fact that our budget has \$2,000 approved for communications, which can be used for technology for our September return to hybrid meetings if needed.
- 7. City Official Comments (Pirrotti)
 - a. Ward 4 MOCR Derek Johnson
 - Announced some new city leaders: acting MPD Chief Pamela Smith and MOCR Director Richard Livingstone

- The Commissioners and Derek discussed a few matters including the lack of a public after action report for the February public safety walk, the need for improved trash cans, and concerns about blight at the property at 501 Kennedy St NW
- b. Ward 4 Councilmember Janeese Lewis George's Office Barbara Rogers
 - Ms. Rogers gave updates about upcoming events, and then turned it over to Kelly Hunt and Nikita Easley to provide updates on public safety from the CM's office
 - **1.** The CM's staff briefly recapped the summer safety strategic planning meeting, which can be viewed in full here.
 - 2. Overview of the summery safety strategic planning meeting: A number of speakers (Heraud, Cure the Streets, InnerCity, DC DBH)
 - 3. The office noted that Kennedy St. crew arrestees are all still being held at DC jail and recapped the crimes arrested for
 - 4. The CM's staff explained that CM Lewis George's no vote on DC's emergency crime legislation bill was due to the provisions related to adult pretrial detention
 - 5. Commissioner Lucarelli noted ongoing public safety concerns at Kennedy & Illinois
