

VIRTUAL PUBLIC MEETING MINUTES ADVISORY NEIGHBORHOOD COMMISSION 4D Wednesday, November 16, 2022, 6:30 PM

The following is a recap of actions taken at the monthly public meeting of Advisory Neighborhood Commission 4D, which took place virtually on Wednesday, November 16, 2022.

Vice Chair Nobil called the meeting to order at 6:33 p.m.

COMMISSIONERS ROLL CALL

Five of six Commissioners present (quorum reached): Erik Lindsjo (4D01); Aryan Rodriguez Bocquet (4D03); Zachary Israel (4D04); Eric Smith (4D05); Jonathan Nobil (4D06) [Note: Commissioner Bowser (4D02) joined the meeting at 7:49p]

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Comm. Nobil moved to amend the agenda to include a resolution to be introduced by Comm. Nobil for consideration by the ANC 4D Commissioners on the Criminal Justice Reform Act

• **Commission action:** Comm. Nobil moved to introduce the resolution, Comm. Rodriguez Bocquet seconded. Passed 4-1. (Comm. Lindsjo opposed.)

Comm. Israel requested to amend the agenda to add several announcements to the Commissioner Announcements section of the agenda, and Comm. Rodriguez Bocquet requested to table tonight's vote re: the approval of the draft October public meeting minutes to December given that there is additional information that is needed to be reviewed in order for them to be complete and accurate.

• **Commission action:** Comm. Nobil moved to amend the agenda to include these additional adjustments; Comm. Rodriguez Bocquet seconded. Passed unanimously: 5-0.

APPROVAL OF OCTOBER 2022 ANC 4D PUBLIC MEETING MINUTES

Comm. Rodriguez Bocquet requested during Approval of Agenda to table this vote to the December public meeting given that there is additional information that needs to be reviewed and confirmed on the draft meeting minutes prior to them getting approved. - Ward 4 SBOE SBOE not present and didn't submit a statement to be read at meeting
- Update from Brian Hamer, Program Director of The Kennedy: The Kennedy celebrated its 4th year at that location; over the last year: 106 families moved out in FY22 92 moved to "positive" destinations (i.e., destinations where a family moves into their own home, moves in with family / friends, or to a transitional facility that better suits their needs); the remaining families stayed for an average of 62 days which is a good average; they currently have 25 families in the building (they can house 45); if residents know of any family that needs housing, first refer them to Virginia Williams Family Resource Center for intake and not The Kennedy; The Kennedy welcomes donations (diapers, women's products, fresh socks and underwear, hats, lightly used jackets and gloves); Contact <u>BHamer@nccf-cares.org</u> 202-845-8070

PRESENTATION: JUDIE SHEPHERD-GORE, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, AND CAMILLE DAVIS, DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC RELATIONS AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH, INNER CITY COLLABORATIVE

No actions taken. Highlights shared:

- Inner City Collaborative is two-thirds of the way staffed; once fully staffed the team will be 10 strong. All Violence Interrupter positions have been staffed. They're looking to fill 3 outreach worker vacancies. 2 VIs and 2 outreach workers are designated to the Kennedy St corridor.
- The Collaborative is six months in and is looking forward to the next 6 months; they're permanent location is at 6230 3rd St NW; right behind Coolidge HS
- They're focusing on forming partnerships at the Georgia Ave / Petworth metro station (they have a team that canvasses that area on a regular basis) and have formed relationships in Park View and Lamond Riggs
- Have met with the incoming Attorney General-elect, Brian Schwalb
