5. Approval of July 2023 ANC 4D Public Meeting Minutes (George)

- a. Commissioner George moved to adopt the July 2023 public meeting minutes with no amendments

- 6. Treasurer's Report (Courniotes)
 - a. ANC 4D has received its quarterly allotment, and now has \$20,046.85 in our account

- a. Ward 4 MOCR Derek Johnson (5 min. / 5 min. Q&A)
 - Mr. Johnson shared some upcoming events in the District
 - He also noted in response to resident concerns about trash and rats that there is unfortunately an ongoing national shortage of "supercans" – trash cans that are more resistant to rats. So the District does not have an ample supply of these cans to deter rats.
 - Mr. Johnson also noted that a new youth curfew went into effect on September 1, and is currently being enforced from 12-6am every day.
- b. Ward 4 Councilmember Janeese Lewis George's Office Barbara Rogers (5 min. / 5 min. Q&A)
 - Ms. Rogers was unable to join ANC 4D's September public meeting

 - a. Uptown Main Street shared information about the Celebrate Petworth festival on September 23

- b. A resident asked for more notice of a job fair
- c. A number of residents raised concerns about public safety in the vicinity of 1st St / Farragut St / New Hampshire Ave NW after multiple shootings in the vicinity this summer and ongoing disruptions. Residents are working together to petition for more lights and security cameras, better maintenance of land near the shopping center, and more regular cleanups.
- d. Residents raised concerns about rats in alleys as well as Providence Hospital shutting down.
