 - i) New guidance by OANC for sign on letters and what is legally required. Great weight is attached only to resolutions passed at public meetings that were properly noticed.
 - ii) ANC Holiday Event CMs were present. Discussed with CM White staff about the permanent ability to hold hybrid meetings. Only temporarily allowed DC Council Action to make it a permanent event. Mr. Hilgandorf asked CM White to try and maintain hybrid meetings.
 - b) Vice Chair (Commissioner Anderson) None.
 - c) Treasurer (Commissioner Hurst) \$17,807.67. No charges, no additions in the last month. Significant uptick in crime, meeting with CM Parker.
 - d) Secretary (Commissioner Galvan) Eckington Parks and Arts and the Eckington Civic Association board positions are opening, always need more, get involved and run!

 - a) Alcohol Licensing (AL) Committee (Ms. Coughlin) new application for Doki BBQ at Bryant Street NE. Committee recommends another settlement agreement. Ask them why they are not aligned with existing Bryant Street developments. Check out the distribution list. Placard with Cannabis a couple placards from ABCA in 5F. Can we add Cannibus requests to the Alcohol Licensing Committee now that ABRA changed to ABCA? Check out the link on any feedback on establishments that serves alcohol, have the committee be in a better position (see website).
 - i) MG and JB to assist with moving from ABRA and the ABCA. MG to work on this. Right Proper Brewery get started on a settlement agreement (JB)
 - b) Community Engagement (CE) Committee No Chair yet, no new update.
 - c) Public Safety & Health (PSH) Committee (Mr. Ehrenpreis) Meeting every third Thursday of the month. This Thursday from 6p-7:30p. Will be hybrid as well. Click on committees and agendas. based practices. City Council trackers on certain legislation. Currently 3 pieces of legislation - Emergency, Safety Commercial Corridors Acts.  - b) Zoning Case 0981 Moving on the amendments:
 - c) JA Had multiple discussions at ANC5F meetings both in person and separate SMD Meeting last Saturday. This resolution is for the support of two of the relief items. Technical Language to plain speak:
 - i) Design Feature relief to allow for the removal of the mansnard roof

- (1) many people did not have much opinion based on the mansnard roof change, just the focus on the 20' back from the existing space.
 - ii) Special Requirements requesting to change to multi-family. By right allows only 2 units. This would allow them to build more than 2 units but does not specify the exact amount.
 - iii) Exceeding beyond the 10' line. Current proposal at 20' in size. Have been significantly differing opinions on that between neighbors and the owner.
 - (1) You are also welcome to submit written testimony and oral testimony so that your voice is heard by the BZA.
 - iv) JB outreach on this project. What is their engagement in the community?
 - (1) Architect on behalf of the applicant. Reached out in June 2023, July month. Met at 2 additional SMD meetings.
 - (2) ECA voted to support the changes in this community.
 - (3) Numu was available at the final presentation meeting.
 - (4) The Hearing for the Board of Zoning Adjustments is in January. BZA has the final say. Will be given great weight, up to the zoning board. Still have opportunity for others to submit testimony altogether, as a granted party status. BZA votes, have to go through a permitting process, have to go through a certificate of occupancy.

 - b) Melissa Littlepage (ML), Communications DIrector, Ward 5 Councilmember Zachary Parker's Office

- ii) Modified government services next week, trash and recycling collection. Public Safety and the Chancellor Row had horrific issues. Daily coordination with MPD. Commissioner Hurst public safety meeting to focus on the chancellor meeting. Thursday at 6:30p - tentative. Should confirm tomorrow morning. Edgewood Recreation Center. Legislation - many pieces of legislation. Safer/stronger DC Legislation. Council passed some of the things. Whole of Government Response to Crime Amendment Act. Is going through the Committee on Judiciary Committee. Take up these bills for a vote in January. CM Parker will be supportive of what will occur, but hasn't seen final versions of the legislation so cannot make agreements yet until has read everything. Pretrial release is a challenge. 18 armed robberies by one person. Allowed out on pre-trial release - is up to the discretion of the court. We do not appoint our judges. Affecting the legislature is needed, but we (the Council) can limit Judge's discretion. Currently if they have committed a violent crime the onus is on the Court to justify why that individual should be held. If an individual is presumed guilty, but there is a proposal to change that the other way - why the individual should NOT be held. Another challenge is the crime lab accreditation - it is a huge problem. Need to have residents talk with the mayor. When the council held the public safety meeting and discussion with Matthew Graves on why are they not papering cases - 1 issues with the crime lab, the second one - body worn camera footage allowed to be seen by MPD officers first. The reason why they are having problems and constitutional issues with body cameras.
 - (1) TH Has CM Parker been very supportive of these efforts? ML Will come before the council in January. Is not a member of the committee on the Judiciary but thinks they can get to yes.
 - (2) AS Crime lab was reopened crime lab by end of year but is still behind. Struggling to get answers from the Mayor
 - (3) MG Traffic Safety is still a huge problem and is getting worse. Crime lab can we put the pressure on the Mayor to withhold her paychecks? Or something to put pressure to actually change things? ML This is a big priority of CM Parker. Once you're a victim of a crime, already too late. STEER Act is beginning to move forward and hold drivers accountable.
