- 2. Public Comment (10 mins., up to 2 minutes per speaker)
 - a. Reginald Harris safety in the area has gotten worse. Have been requesting speed humps with Frank Biega. They have taken a petition to signed by 44 people to install speed bumps on 2nd and Douglas, 2nd and Channing by Lincoln Road. People speed through the stop signs all the time nearby children. So many people don't stop for people at all and it is a dangerous. It happens all the time during evening and night time. Run stop signs. Lived here for 60 years. Can you help to get more speed bumps in the area. What suggestion can we do to help the neighborhood? Douglas got it because of the school on 2nd Street. Safety for everything. Want to work together to get this done.
 - b. Michelle Keegan What is the process for getting a trash can removed? Two nearby her house has been removed. Can they be emptied more frequently?
 - c. Frank Biega submitted mailed in petition, attached to 311 request, submitted on July 18, 2022, should have been resolved by January 18th but it was closed out with no response. When will something happen? Is it a scheduling problem? When does this happen? Would the commission support a resolution to get this done? To have a petition to have between Lincoln Road to Channing
 - d. Melissa Coughlin Drug traffic at 4th and Sun Market, it is only a matter of time

before bullets come by. We see multiple break-ins, same people that comes in. Can the ANC make it a priority? Can we compel properties to help fix issues with trash, etc. as nuisance properties. Lots of other crimes before hand to hand selling. BP gets more traffic which is better but it is still a hang out late at night.

 - i. Have been engaging with DDOT on updates for 2nd and Lincoln. Have heard there is movement but nothing specific yet. Have requested in budget for these items to get addressed. Recommend a bump-out or one-way out onto Lincoln as well. Recommend engagement on Transportation and Public Spaces committee.
 - ii. For 4th and Rhode Island recommend engagement on ABRA Committee, possible to put restrictions on businesses, need public engagement with MPD.

 - i. Trash cans homeless rifle through items and pull them out and make it a mess.
 - ii. We don't get 30-day notices for trash cans.
 - iii. DDOT has reprioritized quarterly each of their project. Speed hump to be at the bottom of their lists.
 - c. AS
 - i. Actively tracking out to engage DDOT. TSI 1.0 to TSI 2.0 changes
 - ii. Exploring how to best engage as a commission
 - iii. File a resolution if the commission agrees to the approach
 - iv. Council resolution Lewis George to require that DPW provide notice. Taking away a trash can to give public notice. Reach out to Councilman Parker to help get his vote on other items. Let your at-large Councilmembers White, Duffie, and Bonds let them know too.
 - d. JA
 - i. Hear traffic safety is a huge problem as a neighborhood.
 - ii. Public Safety More coming up with a forum that MG is helping put together.
 - e. JB
 - i. Used to have trash cans on every corner near me and now just two on a four-block stretch. Resolution tonight is one way 5F is helping to get responses. NOMA Bid can also help in their area. DPW is actively removing trash cans when they should be adding them.

Conclusion: Neighbors brought up crime (drug dealing, littering, gunshots, etc.) and issues at liquor store at 4th and Rhode Island, brought up traffic violence and requested petition for speed bumps or raised crosswalk at 2nd, Lincoln, and Douglas NE, and how/why public trash cans are being removed more and more often on every block. Commissioners responded that resolutions, engagement with DDOT, and reaching out to council member offices is important as it is budget season right now and to work with commissioners on resolutions to support or get engaged with committees offered by the commission.

 - c. It takes money, need someone to purchase it. In 2020 Developers to build on alley lot than your regular lot can get to 90% of the land
 - i. We have a willing partner to engage (developer)
