2. Public Comment (10 mins., up to 2 minutes per speaker)
 - a. Kyle Boardman Scher – State school of education – here with ATC, Andrea Zimmerman. Dual enrollment career and technical education center – high school students nursing or cybersecurity, putting building to productive use in Eckington. Traffic congestion has continued to occur and we wanted to recognize that. 191 students coming to ATC on each day, morning, afternoon, and evening. Using cabs today, 72 cabs coming throughout the day, and it has caused some congestion and apologize for it, acknowledging the issues and concerns. We are shifting partially away from cab based transportation and into a bus approach instead, instead of 72 cabs, 6-10 buses throughout the day to alleviate. DDOT and DGS around creating school based parking restrictions to the ATC along 3rd Street. One block in front of 3rd Street and parking restrictions, 7a-5p, so that buses could come up and kids come out of ATC and get out without blocking traffic. 10-20 cabs

as well as an option without any double parking and safer for students.

It is a full blown shelter. Now lots of men.

 - i. Shelter has onsite employment services. Otherwise they are connecting.
 - ii. SP – working with the shelter – Raymond Faxia is new onsite director.
 - iii. Maddie Johnson – is it operated by DC Government – operated for the Coalition of the Homeless
 - iv. Edgewood Trust. Getting different stakeholders. Find resources and economic opportunities for our youth. Very early conversation.
 - v. North Capitol Trust Builders between RIA and Florida Ave. Connect massive amount of resources to help with outreach and into services and housing. Edgewood Safety Walk. Want more coordination, just need organizing. Also Woonerf on Quincy Lane. Pieces aren't working together.
 - vi. Pinto – scheduled for new mayor's bill. Go to DC Council to sign up for testimony.
 - vii. Reviewed slides. Ward 5 Public Safety Zoom Meeting. 3 different police districts. Deputy Mayor on how we work together. Lots of federal agencies not showing up.

- c. Z.C. Case No. 23-24 (Eckington Mews, LLC – Consolidated PUD and Related Zoning Map Amendment @ Square 3524, Lots 52, 53, 800, 802. and 803 (1708-1710 1st Street, N.E.)
 - i. SP – In 2013, Brian Brown, initial request build apartments in the alleyway, large plot of land in the alleyway. Could be homes, not apartments, agreed to single family homes. Each home would have a basement unit approved by the city. Anyone who has property has the right. Immediate family homes nearby have largely agreed to this.
 - ii. Brian Brown (BB) – Abuts Emery School, then Street and 1st Street. Alley is over ½ acre. Turn into 11 lots. Cannot do it as a matter of right. Face houses towards Emery School (not the shelter), 11 lots in the alley, plus 2 facing 1st street which gives you 13 total. Side by side town houses. On 1st street, we do 15 wide side yard. Put garages, can face the school at the alleyway. 1.5 cars wide but 2 cars deep, 2 car parking under the houses. Close the alleyway to prevent dumping. More affordable side by side. 16.8% affordable, now can 4 affordable?
 - iii. SP – Will be building single family flat. Could rent it or use it as an in-suite. Single flat sold together.
 - iv. Try to sell these – takes a long time to qualify. 11 townhouses upper and lower. The 2 side by side to be single family without rentals. Maddie – what does affordable mean? BB - Unsure what at this time.
 - v. SP – Housing listing. Houses are not moving. BB – expected \$1.2-\$1.4M per home is most likely range
 - vi. BB – Neighborhood Benefits – cameras, homeowners association for MPD and DPW, close alleyway where it gets abandoned. 3 homes on the alleyway.
 - vii. BB - Lives in the neighborhood in Ledroit past 20 years. Limited alleyway to slow people down. More lighting in the alleyway. White spectrum in the back area.
 - viii. BB - Need CM Parker's feedback on the closure of the alleyway but it requires 15 different agencies.
 - ix. ANC Actions – Street naming, alleyway closing, support for PUD
 - x. Each are going to be 3 bedrooms. 3-4 weeks ago have filed.
 - xi. 34' feet in height, eliminate street frontage, pedestrian walkway off 1st Street. Take away parking.
 - xii. SP – have a meeting tomorrow, then come back. Not a lot of objections for housing.
 - 1. Michelle Shelton – Live on unit block of R Street NE. Spoken with Brian. Has morphed over time. Wanted to understand building impact on residents. Units on R Street and lose. Has a massing study been conducted for summer, fall and winter? Street level to impact of height on existing homes. Not enough parking. Is a parking waiver needed? Where will those vehicles be parking, what is that expectation. For the trash collection for those buildings. Have you considered alternate designs.
 - a. Basement is at grade, so more like 5 floors.
 - 2. BB – no varying. No covered roof deck on the back of the building. Not a roof deck. Rental building below. Is not a full basement, is an English basement. At 34' height. Massing study was already

done – No impact on shading for those areas because they are north of the single family homes. They are single family townhouses. Traditional pick-up, one in each garage. Alternate was apartment, but shot down. If by right, facing alleyway would not have any parking provided. We are exceeding parking allotments. Trying to be as sustainable as possible - doing solar, building to LEED standards and EV charging stations

3. SP – Where is A/C units?
 4. BB – on side of emery, not the single family homes. Need to carry taxes as well. Preference is to build and not sell the property. \$7.5M to \$8.5M to build all this, not sure if we will have the financing. Inclined to build it, depends on banks, economy, etc.
 5. Kysa Merritt – live on R Street on area being affected. Preference not to have dumpsters. Not selling as condos. Trash in individual garage. Homes that are back facing to alleyway – we have trash cans in the alleyway. Will there be an issue? Fire hydrants where will they be placed? R Street, where would they be placed? Is there a bike rack that will be there. 3 bedrooms. Is entry way the front from Emery? Garage from the uppers? Would it be inclusionary zoning units and certain amount of income?
 - a. 1710 add fire hydrant there
 - b. Walk up 1st street and then walk into that entrance.
 - c. Traffic – no change to Lincoln and 1st
 - d. Bike racks – 12 racks on the west side next to Lincoln Road and also in the garage.
 - e. \$1.3M – with sustainability is needed. No way to get off grid, but close with solar panels, low energy costs.
 - f. Question about entry – everyone who would entry would go between the last home way before you get to enter at that breezeway.
 6. SP – Fire hydrants – come in from Lincoln Road
 7. Extend time – 9:34 SP – added, 2nd by AS for 10 min extra.
 8. Shelton – just close up to his property line, still has access to his garage.
 - a. Once all signatures, then comes to PUD vote, then sits in a cute for supporting them or not.
