As COVID-19 prevented safe ANC meetings, the ANC also began conducting meetings via Zoom which also provided the ability for constituents to call in via phone to participate. ANC 1C Actions in 2020

This section highlights key issues voted upon and comments submitted to District agencies (as of October 23, 2020).

Financials

- In **December 2019**, the ANC adopted a contract for live-streaming services.
- In September, the ANC adopted a contract to continue live-streaming services.
- In October, the ANC approved the ANC1C budget for FY2021.

Alcoholic Beverage Control and Public Safety

ANC 1C negotiated and approved the following settlement agreements in 2020:

- Los Cuates and stipulated CR license (January)
- Roofers Union (February)
- Amsterdam Falafelshop and stipulated CR license (June)

Other actions:

- In January, the ANC protested CT license for MAHK Meetings for 1807 Florida Ave NW.
- In January, the ANC protested Roofers Union's request to modify occupancy load at 2442-2446 18th Street NW.
- In May, the ANC protested the application by The Game Sports Club/Tiki at 2411 18th Street NW to add an entertainment endorsement and cover charge to their license.
- In July, the ANC passed a motion to notify the ABC of support for Internet sales application by Chufly Imports with a stipulated license.
- In July, the ANC passed a resolution waiving certain time provisions in settlement agreements to allow licensees who have time restrictions on use of outdoor space to operate until midnight and to open for morning hours, as permitted by the Mayor's health emergency re-opening plan.
- In August, the ANC passed a resolution opposing the transfer and substantial change to an ABC license for MAHK Meetings LLC.

Transportation and Vision Zero

In a variety of resolutions and letters to Councilmembers and District agencies, ANC 1C advocated for enhancements in transportation infrastructure and measures to improve safety for pedestrians and cyclists in Adams Morgan.

- In January, the ANC passed a resolution requesting that DDOT conduct a traffic study and consider community feedback on the intersection of 18th Street and Florida Ave.
- In January, the ANC passed a resolution to add micro-mobility corrals at the intersections of Columbia Road/Champlain St and Columbia Road/Ontario Road.
- In March, the ANC passed a resolution in Favor of Emergency Legislation to Complete the 9th Street NW Protected Bike Lane.
- In June, the ANC passed a resolution in support of a letter of support for a crosswalk at the intersection of Biltmore Street and 19th Street.
- In August, the ANC passed a resolution in Favor of 17th St NW Protected Bike Lane.

Construction and Permits

ANC 1C took the following actions related to housing construction and permits:

- Approved a resolution in support of application by Life of Riley (Destination Pet) for a special exception allowing use of 2218-2220 as an animal hospital (January)
- Passed a resolution in support of a solar installation at 1838 Wyoming Avenue (March)
- Approved a resolution in support HPRB submission for renovation plans at 1918 Belmont Road NW (March)
- Passed a resolution to not support an application to occupy public space at 1815 Columbia Rd NW (March)
- Passed a resolution to support a special exception application to BZA for AdMo Heights (1777 Columbia Rd NW) for parking requirements (March)
- Passed a resolution to oppose and appeal B2005159 for 1808 Ontario Place NW (August)
- Passed a resolution in consideration of a project at 1833 Ontario Place (September)
- Passed a resolution in support of a request for an after-hours permit at 1919 Connecticut Avenue NW (September)

Public Space, Art, and Events

In January, ANC 1C passed a resolution of a letter of support for Rock n Roll Marathon 2020 race.

In May, ANC 1C passed a resolution to consider areas for sidewalk extensions in Adams Morgan to support social distancing.

In June, ANC 1C passed a resolution in favor of opening and expanding uses of public space on 18th Street.

In July, ANC 1C passed a resolution supporting a letter of support for a 2021 DCCA Public Art Building Communities Grant application for Concrete Dream.

In July, ANC 1C passed a resolution requiring a face covering while in and around streateries.

In August, ANC 1C passed a resolution supporting a Tree plan for BB&T Plaza.

In August, ANC 1C passed a resolution providing Feedback to DC Board of Elections on locations for voting centers and ballot drop boxes.

In October, ANC 1C passed a resolution sending a letter endorsing The Potter's House grant application to the Great Streets Initiative.
