Dear Mayor Bowser and Chairman Mendelson:

At a duly noticed, regularly scheduled meeting on December 8, 2021, Advisory Neighborhood Commission 3D (“ANC 3D”) unanimously approved the *ANC 3D 2021 Annual Report* with a quorum (6) present at all times.

This annual report satisfies ANC 3D’s statutory reporting obligations under DC Code § 1-309.10(j)(1), which provides that each Commission may file an annual report with the Council and the Mayor for the preceding fiscal year, and (n-1), which provides that each Commission shall publish an annual report summarizing its activities over the preceding 12 months. ANC3D has had a very active Transportation Committee composed of 15 residents and 3 Commissioners. During the year, the Transportation Committee generated for ANC endorsement and transmittal to the appropriate District body:

- A list of priority bike lanes and new sidewalks for construction;
- A list of 150 sidewalk hazards that required repair;
- Far reaching recommendations for the Department of Transportation's long-range plans for the District;
- Carefully considered recommendations for a bike lane on New Mexico Avenue;
- Recommendations regarding improvements on Canal Road;
- Strong support for bus service to the neighborhood; and
- Support for improved access to the Capital Crescent Trail.



KEY ISSUES AND ANC ACTIONS

From October 1, 2020 to December 7, 2021, the Commission voted to approve many official actions. Many of these were resolutions on substantive policy matters in the District. The Commission sent letters to key District officials and Councilmembers advising them on proposed policies, advocating for improvements that align with community preferences, and supporting local activities.

The Commission approved official actions that cover a broad range of topics. During the last fifteen months, ANC 3D addressed everything from a proposed protected bike lane on New Mexico Avenue, NW, to COVID-19 vaccine mandates for DCPS students and staff. In this section, we have chosen to highlight the Commission's work on four key subjects: transportation, public health, government administration, and education.

KEY ISSUE:

TRANSPORTATION

The Commission has worked to address nearly every aspect of transportation in the District. ANC 3D advocated for safe, accessible, and convenient transportation for all District residents by commenting on a wide variety of issues.

Vision Zero

The Commission strongly supports the vision zero initiative, a goal of reaching zero traffic fatalities and serious injuries. ANC 3D has diligently promoted policies that will improve implementation of the Vision Zero initiative and keep vulnerable road users safe.

The Commission approved the following official actions related to Vision Zero:

- Resolution calling on the DC Council and Mayor to prioritize Vision Zero initiatives and redouble its efforts (3D-24-028).
 - The resolution outlines the District government's poor progress toward reaching its Vision Zero goals. The Commission urged full funding and implementation of the Vision Zero Enhancement Omnibus Amendment Act of 2020, active cooperation with ANC Commissioners and Transportation Committees, expeditious installation of infrastructure that protects vulnerable road users, and better data collection.
- Resolution regarding National Walk to School Day and Vision Zero (3D-24-063).
 - The resolution addresses the tragedy of two children being struck by a driver while walking to school on National Walk to School Day. The resolution honors the memory of the late Zy'aire Joshua and Allison Hart, two children killed by drivers this year.

Public Transit

The Commission values public transit and recognizes that many of our constituents rely on it to get to work, school, the grocery store, and medical appointments. ANC 3D has supported maintenance and expansion of public transit in the District because it will reduce both carbon emissions and traffic. ANC 3D is not served by Metrorail, so the Commission paid special attention to preserving Metrobus access and supporting shared micro-mobility.

The Commission approved the following official actions related to public transit:

- Resolution regarding the proposed Metrobus service reductions in WMATA's revised FY2022 proposed budget (3D-24-016).
 - This resolution opposed WMATA's proposal to severely reduce service on key Metrobus routes, including the D5, N2, N4 D6, M4, and N6 lines. The Commission was successful in convincing WMATA to avoid further service reductions and previous service was maintained.
- Letter to WMATA urging reinstatement of N2 and N4 bus routes in Fall 2021 (3D-24-029).
 - This letter urged WMATA to reinstate Metrobus service on the Massachusetts Avenue line, specifically the N2 and N4 routes. It also reiterated the Commission's desire for reinstatement of the D5 route and improvements to D6 service.
- Resolution opposing proposed WMATA rule regarding suspension/ban of customers post-arrest (3D-24-046).
 - This resolution opposed a proposed WMATA rule that the Commission felt was arbitrary, non-evidenced based, and violated the basic principles of due process. After opposition from ANC 3D and numerous community advocacy groups, the WMATA Board of Directors tabled the proposal.
- Resolution on Capital Bikeshare Pricing Structure (3D-24-051).
 - This resolution urged Capital Bikeshare to reconsider its drastic proposed fee increases which would have quadrupled the price of some rides. As a result of the Commission's advocacy, Capital Bikeshare agreed to reduce its fee increases by roughly 50%. This kept public shared-use micromobility affordable for District residents.

Connected Transportation Networks

Connected transportation networks are key to building a convenient and sustainable active transit system for District residents. For this reason, the Commission has fervently advocated for improvements to District-wide transportation planning and bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure within our jurisdiction. Most notably, the Commission made recommendations for substantial improvements to the MoveDC 2021 plan.

The Commission approved the following official actions related to transportation networks:

- Letters to the Department of Transportation regarding the need for new bicycle and sidewalk infrastructure (3D-24-003 and 3D-24-004).
 - The letters, which were drafted by the Transportation Committee, identified certain priority locations for pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure improvements.
- Letters commenting on MoveDC 2021 (3D-23-043, 3D-24-013, 3D-24-033).
 - MoveDC is the long-range planning at the Department of Transportation. ANC 3D submitted three sets of comments on the Department's plans, pointing out where this plan does not address several of the transportation needs of the ANC 3D neighborhood, does not have meaningful long-range goals, and many cases, and especially with regard to climate change, set nice sounding goals but said little in terms of how the Department will meet them.
- Resolution on New Mexico Avenue Bike Path (3D-24-036).
 - This resolution supported DDOT's proposal to install a protected bike lane, along with pedestrian improvements, on New Mexico Avenue and Tunlaw Road. Once constructed, the cycle track would allow ANC 3D residents to safely travel the entire corridor by bicycle. ANC 3D approved this resolution after extensive public comment, consultation with the Transportation Committee, and negotiation with DDOT.

KEY ISSUE: COVID-19 RESPONSE

As the COVID-19 pandemic upended normal District government operations, the Commission quickly moved to make recommendations about how to best handle the pandemic.

The Commission approved the following official actions related to COVID-19:

- Resolution on funding for outdoor learning (3D-24-017).
 - This resolution supported DCPS plans to invest \$9 million in creative learning models and echoed the State Board of Education's request for at least \$4 million for outdoor learning options.
- Letter to DC Council and OANC about post-public health emergency virtual attendance of ANC meetings (3D-24-035).
 - This letter urged enactment of legislation that allows for ANC meetings to operate in a hybrid format after the conclusion of the public health emergency. Legislation was passed to allow for ANC meetings to remain virtual until February 2022, but ANC 3D's other requests were not directly addressed.
- Letter to DC Council encouraging continued use of "virtual testimony" after pandemic-related precautions are relaxed (3D-24-034).
 - This letter requested that the DC Council maintain a virtual testimony option for residents at hearings by adopting a "hybrid" model post-pandemic. The DC Council appears poised to continue allowing virtual testimony, to a certain extent, after the pandemic concludes.
- Resolution urging vaccination mandate to include DCPS, charter schools, and childcare facilities (3D-24-049).
 - This resolution urged the Mayor to amend order 2021-099 to require all public school employees, child care facility employees, and any District government employees, contractors, grantees, or interns who have regular in-person contact with minors to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19, with limited exceptions. The Mayor implemented the strengthened vaccine requirement.
- Resolution endorsing Council Bill 24-423, the Coronavirus Immunization of School Students and Early Childhood Workers Amendment Act of 2021 (3D-24-068).
 - This resolution endorsed efforts to add the COVID-19 vaccine to the list of required vaccinations for all school students and early childhood workers in the District. A public hearing on the bill was held in late October but further legislative action has not been taken.

KEY ISSUE: GOVERNMENT ADMINISTRATION

ANC 3D has been focused on improving District government processes, expanding democratic access, and ensuring effective and efficient service delivery.

The Commission approved the following official actions related to government administration:

- Resolution containing recommendations to the DC Council regarding ANC representation for unique constituencies (3D-24-018).
 - This resolution urged the DC Council and Board of Elections to make reforms that facilitate sustained ANC representation for transient populations. It specifically requested legislation to make nominating petitions available sooner and permanently permit electronic signatures. The resolution also urged the DC Council to allow ANC vacancies to be filled during a public health emergency. The DC Council made that change in Summer 2021 but ANC 3D's other requests were not addressed.
- Letter requesting additional support for the Office of the ANC (3D-24-023).
 - This letter requested additional support for both the Office of Advisory Neighborhood Commissions and the Commissions themselves. It urged funding for additional OANC staff, the creation of a fund for Commissions to request confidential, impartial, legal, or other expert advice, and the establishment of an advisory board to provide guidance to OANC. As a result of this letter, an advisory board, known as the Advisory Committee to the Office of Advisory Neighborhood Commissions for Services ("ACTOS") was created.
- Letter regarding internship inequities in the DC Government (3D-24-055).
 - This resolution urged every branch of the District government that offers internships to students to make improvements to their programs. ANC 3D asked these entities to create clear and transparent job postings, pay all interns a fair wage, and conduct exit interviews. ANC 1B passed a similar resolution and the Commissions are coordinating to advocate for an internship fund to be created in the FY2023 annual budget.

KEY ISSUE: EDUCATION

The Commission has taken a special interest in education issues over the past fifteen months. Students from K-12 to college make up a significant portion of ANC 3D's population and their interests are vital to the District's success.

The Commission approved the following official actions related to education:

- Letter to Zoning Commission regarding American University Campus Plan (3D-23-041).
 - After hearing from residents in three separate meetings, ANC 3D passed a resolution in November, 2020 endorsing the American University 2021 Campus Plan. ANC 3D then testified before the Zoning Commission in the Spring of 2021 regarding the ANC's findings. At the end of the hearings, the Zoning Commission indicated orally that they would approve the Campus Plan, consistent with the recommendations of ANC 3D.
- Resolution regarding GDS school purchase for GDS (3D-24-006).
 - This resolution supported acquisition of the former Georgetown Day School site for use by DCPS. The Commission believed the purchase was an important way to address overcrowding in Ward 3 public schools. The District government purchased the property.
- Letter to Mayor on New Hardy School Construction (3D-24-031).
 - To address current and future overcrowding across all grade levels in ANC 3D, DCPS identified two new potential school sites; a reconfigured public school at the former GDS campus on MacArthur Blvd and a new campus co-located with Hardy Park at Foxhall Rd and Q St NW. ANC 3D wrote a letter to the Mayor that was in line with the findings of the community working group. The letter stated strong support for both sites, with two key provisions- protecting Hardy Park from encroachment, and reviewing the Lab School lease to allow the city to take some or all of the property back for public use. A formal decision on both sites is still pending.
- Resolution regarding Key water leaks (3D-24-052).
 - This resolution requested that the DCPS Chancellor assist ANC 3D in advocating for needed and long-awaited repairs of numerous leaks at Francis Scott Key Elementary School.

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

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


