## ANC 6C Annual Report 2023

ANC 6C, to meet the requirements of Section 1.309-10(n-1) of the Code of the District of Columbia, reports that during the twelve months since the 2022 Annual Report, conducted the following:

- Held 11 public meetings of the commission, via WebEx platform;
- At these meetings provided opportunity for brief community announcements from members of the public, government officials, and representatives of various organizations;
- Benefited from the work of commissioners and 6C residents appointed to the following committees: Alcoholic Beverage Licensing; Environment, Parks and Events; Grants; Planning, Zoning, and Economic Development; Transportation and Public Space;
- Protested two applications for alcoholic beverage licenses or renewals if settlement agreements were not reached beforehand; considered four additional beverage licensing issues;
- Approved recommendations on matters of concern to the Mayor and the Council of the District of Columbia, and to agencies and departments of the District of Columbia; including on crime and on the commercialization of residential property to the Mayor and Council of the District of Columbia; at least ten to the District Department of Transportation; two to the Federal Railroad Administration of the U.S. Department of Transportation concerning Union Station expansion; and at least 11 to other District offices;
- Provided written testimony to the D.C. Council Committee on Transportation and the Environment concerning proposed WMATA bus routes;
- Designated commissioners or committee members to represent ANC 6C in nine hearings, meetings or proceedings, including two related to alcoholic beverage licensing matters;
- Awarded grant of \$10,000 to the Capitol Hill Cluster School (grant disallowed after the fact by OANC); and \$4,000 to Capitol Hill Montessori;
- Regularly monitored the development of parks and open spaces, as well as the condition and maintenance of parks throughout the ANC 6C area, particularly Stanton Park and Swampoodle Terrace; and
- Posted agendas, minutes and reports of its meetings and committee meetings, and copies of
  its correspondence, as well as information on items of interest, on a timely basis, on its
  website.

ANC 6C in the 12 months preceding December 1, 2023, renewed efforts to raise awareness with D.C. agencies to the problem of commercialization of residential properties; the rise in crime and lack of prosecution of serious crime; and requested an action plan to counter the deterioration of the H Street NE cityscape and business sector. The ANC continued its efforts to monitor developments associated with the proposed Union Station expansion project.
