- DC budget: House included DC in their spending bill to reduce agency budgets by 10 percent, about 1B dollars for the district. If the Senate passes this bill, DC's currect FY25 budget will be reduced byroughly \$1 billion this is DC taxpayer dollars- not federal funding. District working to remove this rider / clause from the spending bill as the District is not a federal government agency and this should not apply to the district.

Votes:

- Cmr. Mckinney moved a motion to approve the meeting minutes meetings for Dec 2024 and Dec 2024 Special meeting, seconded by Cmr. Davis. The motion passed unanimously 5-0 (Cmr. Donahue joined after the vote).
- Cmr. Mckinney moved to oppose the ABCA growing license for 116 Marion Barry Ave. SE, seconded by Cmr. Foreman, and passed unanimously 6-0.

- Cmr. McKinney moved a motion to support Redbrick zoning application for the design of phase II parcel 5 of the Bridge District, seconded by Cmr. Redman. Motion passed 5-1-0.
- Commissioner Davis moved a motion for an additional \$1,000 for the the communications consultant and apply for an administrative consultant for the OANC technical assistance fund. Motion passes 5 -0-1. Note, this is a carryover from the previous term.
- Cmr. Davis moved a motion to support the grant application for DC Explosives that has been approved by the OANC for \$1000 seconded by Cmr. McKinney. Motion passess unanimously 6-0.
- Cmr. Davis moved a motion to set a \$300 limit per commission to purchase office supplies annually, seconded by Cmr. Donahue. Motion passed unaimously 6-0.
- Cmr. Davis moved to approve the FY25 Q1budget report, seconded by Cmr. Redman. Motion passes 4-1-0.

Cmr. White moved to close and everyone agreed. The Meeting adjourned at 9:25 pm.
