ANC1D Annual Report FY24, October 2024 – September 2025

Transportation & Pedestrian Safety

ANC1D has passed multiple resolutions requesting prioritization for traffic safety improvement (TSI) at intersections within Mount Pleasant. We have also been in regular contact with the National Park Service and Federal Highway Administration about the project planned to connect the 17th Street NW sidewalk to Piney Branch Parkway (now scheduled for winter 2025).

Community grants and public service funds:

ANC1D provides funding opportunities to benefit our community by using its budget allotment funds to award community grants to organizations “for public purposes within the Commission area,” in accordance with D.C. Code, § 1-309.13. As amended by D.C. Law 13-135.

In FY25, ANC1D awarded community grants for the following projects:

- \$4,000 to support food delivery by Food for All (this grant was returned by the grantee as they were unable to fulfill the project as originally planned)
- \$4,000 to support the Mount Pleasant Street Lights project.
- \$1,500 to support native plantings by the Mount Pleasant Village.
- \$2,000 to support the Parkwood Place Back to School Block party.
- \$1,500 to support the housing research by the Mount Pleasant Village.

Financial Report:

In Q1 FY2025, ANC 1D had a starting balance of \$70,452.64. After receiving \$10,506.86 and dispersing \$20,182.36, ANC1D finished FY2025 with an ending balance of \$65,387.56.
