What is an ANC?

Advisory Neighborhood Commissions (ANCs) are locally elected bodies which consider a wide range of policies and programs affecting their neighborhoods, including street improvements, zoning, liquor licenses, public safety, and sanitation and trash collection. An ANC presents its positions and recommendations, also known as advice, on issues to various District government agencies, the Executive Branch, and the Council.

Under certain conditions, ANC advice must be given "great weight" by those agencies, meaning that they must acknowledge the advice and explain why they do or do not accept it. ANC 6E collectively represents D.C. residents in 9 single-member

or do not accept to have be collectively represents Districts in a single member districts (SMDs), each represented by a locally elected ANC Commissioner.
