Establishment of Quorum:

Commissioner Pagats called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and announced there was a quorum. Commissioners 3C01, 3C02, 3C03, 3C04, 3C05, 3C06, 3C07, and 3C08 present.

Verification of Notice:

Commissioner Pagats confirmed that notice of the meeting was sent to the local community listservs, apartment listserv moderators, and posted on the ANC3C website and sent out via the ANC3C Newsletter.

Approval of Agenda and Consent Calendar:

Commissioner Pagats moved to approve the agenda and items on the consent calendar. The motion was seconded and approved by unanimous voice vote. The agenda was approved by unanimous voice vote, 8-0-0.

1. SMD Reports:

- **3C03:** Commissioner Pagats reports the debut of the new baby elephant at the National Zoo, shares traffic information regarding zoo guests.

2. Committee Reports:

- Safe, Sustainable Transportation Committee presented by Commissioner Prinzo: no updates.

- Transparency and Public Process presented by Commissioner Prinzo: No reports.
- Community Engagement & Grants presented by Commissioner Kripke: met in February and requests grants from the community and fellow commissioners.
- Planning, Zoning, Housing, and Economic Development Committee presented by Commissioner Pagats: no updates.
- Residential Historic Preservation Committee presented by Commissioner Nash: no updates.
- Environmental Justice Committee presented by Commissioner Kripke: committee has announced an art contest through the Cleveland Park library, inviting contestants to submit bookmark-sized designs to the Cleveland Park library to celebrate Earth Day. Winners of the contest will be selected by a panel of judges on April 15th.
- Virtual, Hybrid, and In-Person Meeting Task Force presented by Commissioner Bose: April meeting will be hybrid at the Cleveland Park Library on April 20th at 6:30 PM.
- Public Safety Committee presented by Commissioner Nash and Lieutenant Paul Johnson, MPD: Commissioner Nash introduces Lieutenant Johnson. Lieutenant Johnson shares crime report, civil service unit updates, and invites community engagement.
 - Commissioner Bose and Commissioner Littauer ask Lieutenant Johnson follow-up questions.

3. Mayor, Council, Agency, Community Organizations

- Mayor's Office of Community Relations (MOCR) - William Owen Cox announces Ward 3 MOCR office hours at Cleveland Park Library on March 27th from 3-5 PM as well as Mayor's Office community cleanup events.
- Councilmember Frumin's Office Representative Trisha Kondobala shares updates on the budget process and pertinent dates. Workday in the Ward with Councilmember Frumin to take place on March 26th at Compass Coffee in Spring Valley.
- Cassandra Hetherington from Cleveland Park Main Street shares new business openings in Cleveland Park: UPS, new dispensary, Club Soda and more. Hetherington shares events along the promenade and throughout the commercial corridor.

Community Forum:

1. No community members make announcements.

Commission Business:

- Discussion and vote on [Resolution to Approve a Grant of \\$4,935 to Green Spaces for DC \(GSDC\)](#) for Cleveland Park Community Tree Engagement Series (pending OANC review).
 - Commissioner Kripke shares that the grant application has been rejected by the OANC. Commissioner Kripke opens the floor to discussion, Commissioner Prinzo seconds:
 - Chairperson Pagats proposes to issue a direct expense to the organization rather than administering a grant.
 - Commissioners Nash, Kripke, Prinzo, Miles, and Pagats discuss. Stella Tarney provides information.
 - Chairperson Pagats moves to approve a direct expense, not exceeding \$5K, to be written to Green Spaces for DC to conduct itemized program engagement in

ANC3C. The vote passes with unanimous consent: 8-0-0.

- Discussion and vote on [Resolution to Approve a Grant of \\$5,000 to Jackson Reed High School Crew Team](#) to purchase equipment necessary (boat) for its rowers to compete in the sport.
 - Chairperson Pagats shares that OANC has approved the grant. Commissioner Kripke introduces the grant. Chris Lisi, community member and Jackson Reed Rowing parent, expresses her gratitude for support. Commissioner Nash expresses his support.
 - Chairperson Pagats moves to vote. The motion passes unanimously, 8-0-0.

Treasurer's Report

- Commissioner Kripke shares that expenses related to [ANC3C Resolution 2026-003](#) have been administered.
- Revised QFRs for Q1 and Q2 discussed.
 - Chairperson Pagats moves to approve. Commissioner Kripke seconds. The motion passes unanimously 8-0-0.
- Discussion and vote on utilizing ANC3C Direct Expense funds to be used for various activities/rentals to be used at Woodley House's inaugural Spring Block Party on Saturday, April 11. The event will take place from 3:30 to 6:30 that afternoon, on the campus of Maret School (3000 Cathedral Ave NW).

 - Commissioner Pagats moves to approve direct expenses for Woodley House's Spring Block Party not exceeding \$8,705.14. The motion passes unanimously, 8-0-0.
