

ANC 6D Monthly Business Meeting Minutes February 17, 2026 – via Zoom

The Commission convened at 7:00 p.m. The following Commissioners were in attendance: Gail Fast (6D03), Rhonda Hamilton (6D08), Fredrica (Rikki) Kramer (6D07), Bruce Levine (6D06), Andrea Pawley (6D04), Chearie Phelps-El (6D05), and Gottlieb Simon (6D02, chairing). Not present: Marquell Washington (6D01). Also present: Administrator Jaime L. Jarvis.

Approval of the Agenda

The agenda was approved by general consent.

Public Safety Report

Captain Paul Hrebenak of the Metropolitan Police Department, 1st District, discussed monthly crime statistics, announced a temporary commander (Commander Christopher Dorsey), and responded to Commissioners' questions.

Community Announcements

There were no community announcements.

Government Announcements

Eric Salmi, representing Councilmember Charles Allen, (1) thanked the ANC for its partnership related to the Southwest Farmers Market; (2) announced that drinking water remains safe after the sewage spill at the Potomac River Interconnector and that repairs will likely take 2 to 4 weeks; and (3) shared updates on the decoupling of local DC tax law from the federal tax code.

Commissioner Announcements

Commissioner Pawley announced (1) that recent communication from Transwestern (developer of the lots at 375 and 425 M Street SW) to some residents reflects a proposal only, not a final agreement; and (2) Diverse Markets and the Wharf have a commitment to open the market at the Wharf on April 4.

Commissioner Kramer: (1) announced that a suit has been brought against the Trump administration's plans to redo the East Potomac Park golf course; (2) commented on the passing of Jesse Jackson who had once been DC's shadow senator; and (3) announced the upcoming Budget Engagement Forums for residents, including a Senior TeleTownhall and the release of the FY 2026 Green Book, DC's Small Business Enterprise Opportunity Guide.

Community Concerns

Resident Karl Fraser raised a concern about a new bus stop at the 1400 block of South Capitol Street SW and asked for the ANC's support to have that stop relocated to either the 1300 or 1500 block to reduce impact on residences.

Office of Planning: Discussion of DC 2050

Nick Kushner, with Diamond Thompson-Smith, both of the Office of Planning, presented a PowerPoint on DC 2050 and responded to Commissioners’ questions.

Approval of January 2026 Minutes

The January 2026 minutes were approved as presented without objection.

Consent Agenda

The Commission **approved** the PanCAN PurpleStride on April 25, 2026, and the Race For Hope on May 3, 2026.

ABC Matters

There was no new business to discuss.

Task Force on Pedestrian Safety Recommendations

Commissioner Simon moved to approve the recommendations of the Task Force on Pedestrian Safety. Following discussion, the Commissioners **voted to postpone** further action to March.

Global Citizens PCS

As Commissioner Hamilton has sent a letter of support from her Single Member District for the Global Citizens Public Charter School, the Commissioners **agreed** that it was unnecessary to send another letter from the ANC.
