OVERVIEW



Advisory Neighborhood Commission 3C (ANC3C), at a duly noticed public meeting held on November 17, 2025, at which a quorum of Commissioners was present, voted with 7 yeas, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions to file this Annual Report with the Mayor of the District of Columbia (Mayor), the Council of the District of Columbia (Council), and the Office of Advisory Neighborhood Commissions (OANC), as well as publish this Report on the Commission's website.

This Report covers Commission and Commissioner's activities between November 2024 and November 2025 but excludes actions taken at the Commission's November 17, 2025, meeting given the Commission's vote to approve the Report at that meeting.

This Report also satisfies the Commission's statutory reporting obligations. See DC Code § 1-309.10(j)(1) (providing that each Commission may file an annual report with the Council and the Mayor for the preceding fiscal year); and (n-1) (providing that each Commission shall publish an annual report summarizing its activities over the preceding 12 months).

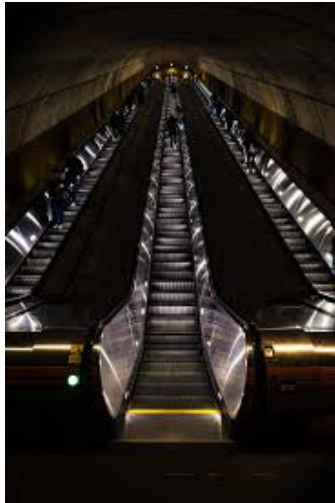
