I. Welcome, Call to Order & Roll Call

Chair Carlson called the meeting to order at 7:04 PM. She confirmed a quorum was present with four commissioners in attendance (Carlson, Baer, Guzman, and Rofman). The January meeting agenda was adopted without objection.

II. Administrative Items

- Election of 2026 Executive Officers: The Commission voted to retain the same leadership positions held in 2025: Courtney Carlson (Chair), Mitchell Baer (Vice Chair), Sue Guzman (Treasurer), and Amy Rofman (Secretary). The motion passed 4-0-0.
- Adoption of 2026 Meeting Dates: The Commission approved the following meeting schedule for 2026: Feb 17, March 10, April 21, May 19, June 16, July 21, Sept 15, Oct 20, and Nov 17.
- Committee Chair Confirmations: The Commission re-confirmed Paul Harrison (Streets and Sidewalks), Kathy Sykes (Parks and Watersheds), and Sue Guzman (Schools and Universities) as committee chairs. The Commission is actively seeking a chair for the Housing and Neighborhoods Committee.

III. Regular Agenda - Community Forum

- DC Metropolitan Police Department (MPD)
 - Crime Statistics (Last 30 Days): Lieutenant Forrest reported 1 Assault with a Dangerous Weapon (ADW) (arrest made/case closed), 1 burglary (domestic situation), and 4 thefts from autos.
 - Traffic Enforcement: Increased presence was noted at Porter and 34th Street following a pedestrian incident; one arrest was made for driving without a permit.
 - Community Advisory: Residents were urged to report all incidents, including vandalism, to ensure they appear on crime stats for resource allocation. A new public alert link was shared: public.govdelivery.com/accounts/DCWASH/subscriber/new.
- Committee Reports
 - Streets and Sidewalks: Paul Harrison discussed ongoing safety concerns, including a recent rollover accident involving a mail carrier on Fessenden Street. Commissioner Rofman raised pedestrian safety concerns at Yuma and Reno and stated her intention to seek a vote at the next meeting for “See Me” flags while awaiting action from DDOT.

- Parks and Watersheds: Kathy Sykes highlighted MLK weekend service opportunities, including litter cleanups and invasive plant removals at Reservation 630 West and behind Politics and Prose.
- Forest Hills Park Resolution: The Commission supported a resolution for park improvements, including:
 - Replacement of the playground fence and gate.
 - Removal of the sandbox (no longer maintained by DPR).
 - Installation of a spray park and a permanent restroom facility.
 - Repair of the amphitheater and broken water fountain.
- DC Water Presentation
 - Lead Service Line Replacement: Through the "Lead Free DC" program, DC Water is replacing lead and galvanized pipes at no cost to owners.
 - Active Construction: There are currently 17 blocks in active construction within ANC 3F. Homeowners are urged to sign "Right of Entry" (ROE) forms to permit work on private property.
- Grant Requests
 - Jackson-Reed Rowing Team: The team requested a \$5,000 grant for rowing equipment. They noted that they are a standalone 501(c)(3) and receive no funding from DCPS.

IV. Adjournment

The meeting adjourned at 8:55 PM. Chair Carlson thanked the host, Forest Hills of DC, and all attendees for their participation. The meeting adjourned at approximately 9:00 PM.
