Chair Kevin Cataldo called the meeting to order at 7:04 PM EDT and called roll.

### **Meeting Roll Call**

#### **Guest Speaker: Councilmember Christina Henderson**

Councilmember Christina Henderson joined the meeting and provided updates followed by a question-and-answer session.

She outlined the upcoming budget timeline. The Mayor is scheduled to present the budget on April 10. The Council will recess the following week. Budget hearings will begin at the end of April.

She highlighted recent legislative activity. The PREP Amendment Act of 2025 would remove cost sharing for HIV prevention treatment and prohibit insurance discrimination based on HIV status. The bill remains under congressional review.

She also noted new legislation including a bill to increase contribution limits for college savings plans due to rising tuition costs (e.g. rates approaching \$98,000 at George Washington University). Additional legislation includes the Consumer Levies on Obstructed Garbage Amendment Act to address issues with flushable wipes, and a bill to expand public trash and recycling infrastructure to address rodent concerns.

Upcoming events include roundtables for nominees to the Board of Nursing and Board of Funeral Directors, and a hearing on Cedar Hill operations scheduled for April 6.

Councilmember Henderson also invited participation in upcoming training related to ranked choice voting in advance of future elections.

#### **Community Questions and Discussion**

Commissioners and community members raised questions focused on core service delivery and public safety.

Discussion on garbage and recycling focused on the need for consistent recycling streams and reliable container access. Members recommended audits of service schedules by the Department of Public Works and the Department of General Services.

Public restroom access was raised as an ongoing concern. Participants discussed the need to restore pilot programs, secure funding, and assign clear project management responsibility to ensure long term availability.

Public safety discussion focused on juvenile exclusion zones and curfew enforcement. Members discussed community expectations and the need for structured youth programming to support long term outcomes.

Budget priorities included access to health insurance, childcare affordability, and economic growth strategies to attract residents and businesses.

### **Reports from the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD)**

#### **Second District**

Lt. A Sakulich of the Second District reported a reduction in crime from 50 incidents to 27 over the year. The report included a homicide arrest connected to a February 11 incident.

#### **Third District**

Lt. Herring of the Third District reported that violent crimes update detailing burglaries and robberies, most cases under investigation. Mention of multiple related incidents, including arrests made in specific cases.

### **Reports from Ward 2 DC Council with Hannah Ames**

The Office of Councilmember Pinto provided updates on tax filing timelines, budget planning, and upcoming agency hearings. The office also discussed juvenile curfew measures and announced community cleanup events tied to Earth Day.

### **Reports from Jimika Williams, MOCRS Ward 2**

The Mayor's Office reported that the budget will be released in mid-April. Representatives will attend future ANC meetings. The office also announced a spring cleanup event scheduled for April 25. Public Safety Discussion.

### **Consent Agenda**

The Commission approved the consent agenda, including the March meeting minutes, amendment to February meeting minutes which reflected updated treasurer report of QFRs and the current Treasurer's report. The Treasurer reported expenses that included the administrator's salary of \$1,126.12, Federal Income Withholding payment \$992.03 and DC income withholding \$75.00

The motion to approve the consent agenda passed unanimously.

### **Committee Reports**

**The Community Development Committee** had no updates.

**The Alcohol and Cannabis Policy Committee** had no updates

**The Public Space and Transportation Committee** reported on safety improvements along 15th Street and projects in the Logan Circle area. The Committee advanced a resolution supporting the 11th Street protected bike lane project. Members emphasized the need for continued community input, particularly regarding parking impacts.

**The Public Safety Committee** reported that the committee is working on a public safety walk throughout ANC 2F, potentially towards late April or early May. More information forthcoming.

### **New Business**

The Commission considered support for the 11th Street protected bike lane project. Discussion focused on safety benefits and the need to balance transportation improvements with community concerns related to parking and roadway design. The Commission voted to support the project unanimously.
