**5. PROJECT GRANT APPLICATION FROM MVT CID**

**MOTION:** The Commission APPROVED (3 yeas – 1 nay [Commissioner Hans] – 1 abstention [Commissioner Abu-Khalaf]) a Grant Application in the amount of \$4,200 from the Mount Vernon Triangle Community Improvement District (CID) for its Photo Walk project, contingent upon a finding of permissibility from the Office of Advisory Neighborhood Commissions (OANC). **6. PUBLIC SAFETY DISCUSSION WITH METROPOLITAN POLICE DEPARTMENT FIRST AND FIFTH DISTRICTS**

Lt. Greg Archer (1D) provided a brief report and stated MPD has been focused on incidents of disorderly conduct by juveniles in the Chinatown area. He noted that MPD's First District has three juvenile curfew zones that include Chinatown, NoMa, and the Navy Yard.

**7. UPDATE FROM AND DISCUSSION WITH COUNCILMEMBER CHARLES ALLEN**

Councilmember Charles Allen provided an update on the following topics: **(1)** his newly introduced bill – “*Guiding Renewable Interconnection and Distribution (GRID) Act*”; **(2)** Upcoming Budget Hearings; **(3)** Upcoming Ward 6 Budget Town Hall; **(4)** Great Ward 6 Spring Clean; **(5)** STEER Act. A question-and-answer period followed.

**8. UPDATE ON THE E STREET BRIDGE HOUSING COMMUNITY ADVISORY TEAM**

Commissioner Hans provided an update and stated he and Commissioner Prince attended an introductory meeting about a month ago of the Community Advisory Team (CAT). The CAT is a partnership between DHS, Miriam's Kitchen, ANCs, civic and tenant associations, and facility residents. The main focus of the meeting was to develop a Good Neighbor Agreement that will outline shared goals and responsibilities of the partners. The next meeting is scheduled for April 20, 2026 at 6:30 p.m. via Zoom.

- Caitlin Haswell stated she is a resident of Capital Plaza apartments at 35 E Street NW. She raised noise issues of early morning and late deliveries to the Hilton Hotel (525 New Jersey Avenue NW), some as early as 5:30 a.m. and as late as 11:15 p.m. The issue is that the hotel's delivery entrance is in the shared alley and the associated noise with these deliveries is very disruptive. She asked if there are designated hours in which businesses can receive deliveries. Commissioner Abu-Khalaf provided her with his email address and will work with her offline to loop in different DC offices and other entities to come up with a coordinated approach to try and resolve the problem.
