Lt. Archer provided a brief update on 1D's posture regarding juvenile curfew zones in Chinatown, NoMa, and the Navy Yard. He also reported on crime for the last 30 days and YTD. Lt. Tutt reported significant arrests were made in a robbery that occurred on 4/18/26 at 461 H Street NW.

7. PRESENTATION FROM DDOT ON NOTICE OF INTENT (NOI) FOR SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS AT THE INTERSECTIONS OF MASSACHUSETTS AVENUE NW, 5TH STREET NW, AND I STREET NW [SMD 6E09]

Kelly Jeong-Olson provided a presentation on DDOT's Notice of Intent (NOI) for Safety Improvements at the Intersections of Massachusetts Avenue NW, 5th Street NW, and I Street NW. 9. REQUEST FOR SUPPORT – NoMA BID FOR THE ALLEE PROJECT (EAST SIDE OF FIRST STREET NE BETWEEN L AND M STREETS)

MOTION: The Commission APPROVED (6 yeas – 0 nays – 0 abstentions) a resolution of ANC 6E support for the NoMa Allee Project. (Motion by Commissioner Fiedler, Second by Commissioner Abu-Khalaf).

10. GRANT FUNDING REQUEST FROM ANC 6E: COBB PARK COMMUNITY CELEBRATION
Kenyattah A. Robinson, Mount Vernon Triangle CID

MOTION: The Commission APPROVED (5 yeas – 1 nay [Commissioner Hans] – 0 abstentions) a \$6,000 grant from ANC 6E to the Mount Vernon Triangle Community Improvement District for the Spring Festival 2026 at Cobb Park to cover band booking fees, with the condition that 6E's sponsorship is acknowledged and advertised at the event. (Motion by Commissioner Abu-Khalaf, Second by Commissioner Prince).

11. ANC 6E TO DESIGNATE OANC AS AGENT RELATED TO DIFS AND PASS ACCOUNTING SYSTEM

MOTION: The Commission APPROVED (6 yeas – 0 nays – 0 abstentions) an ANC 6E resolution giving formal authorization to designate the Office of Advisory Neighborhood Commissions (OANC) as its agent solely for the purpose of completing initial setup, account registration, and 3-year renewal of ANC 6E's supplier profile in the District's DIFS and PASS systems. (Motion by Commissioner Abu-Khalaf, Second by Commissioner Alhadeff).

12. OPEN FORUM

- Commissioner Prince provided an update and stated that he and Commissioner Hans had been contacted by their constituents to remove the rumble strips in the ramp leading to I-395. They have written to DDOT and at one point the rumble strips were supposed to be removed. He is hopeful that with Noah Glasgow now being the Ward 6 liaison to DDOT, this can move forward.
- Commissioner Abu-Khalaf – **(1)** stated he crafted a job description for the Executive Director position as well as scoring criteria and ran them both by OANC. OANC had no issues other than flagging that this is not a full-time position with benefits but a contractor position paid hourly. He will follow up with Commissioners via email about posting the ad; **(2)** raised the need to develop a procedures manual or guidance about grants.
- Commissioner Hans stated a decision needs to be made about whether to move forward with the Executive Director Trainer position, coming up with the application and criteria for that, and possibly finalizing it during the next Executive Committee meeting.
